
HAVE FUN



Planning your wedding day schedule is like putting together the perfect playlist – it sets the rhythm for a day filled with love and celebration! If you're steering the ship without a planner, it's super important to sync up with your vendors and photographer. We photographers love to go with the flow of your day, capturing the magic as it unfolds, all according to your well-thought-out plan.

Here's a little tip: Be generous when pencilling in time to getting ready. Hair and makeup have a sneaky way of taking longer than expected, and the last thing you want is to feel rushed before you walk down the aisle. Plus, that extra time is perfect for snapping gorgeous bridal portraits while relaxed and glowing.

And hey, remember to sneak away with your sweetheart for a couple of photos! We suggest setting aside about 20 minutes during that dreamy golden hour light – it's pure photo magic. Then, as the stars come out, let's grab a few more minutes to play with some creative night lighting. It's all about making your day picture-perfect, super chill, and fun!



YOUR WEDDING TIMELINE

As you plan your big day, you might wonder, "How much time do we need for those awesome photos?" If you're dreaming of something more spontaneous than the classic, posed wedding pics, why not go for a photojournalistic or documentary vibe?

It's all about catching those real, unscripted moments without making the day feel like a photo shoot. Of course, we'll carve out some particular time for those essential Bride/Groom and couple's snaps. But apart from that, expect a laid-back, candid style that lets everyone be their fabulous selves – most won't even notice the camera!

Our motto? Let the day roll out beautifully and naturally. We're old hands at juggling tight timelines while keeping everything chill and fun. We've sketched the schedule to help you picture how the day might go, photo-wise.

Getting Ready

Please ensure you're all glammed up and ready to go at least an hour before heading out.

Bridal Portraits: Let's take about 20 minutes for some stunning shots.

Groom Portraits: We'll need about 10 minutes (even quicker if we're all in the same spot).

Bridal Party: Another 10 minutes to capture the fun with your squad. Plus, there is a 30-minute cushion before the ceremony for early birds and last-minute priming.

Ceremony

Family Photos and a Big Group Shot: We'll wrap this up in 30 minutes.

Reception

Bride & Groom Portraits: Set aside 15-20 minutes for those dreamy, golden hour pics. **Nighttime Magic:** Another 10 minutes later for some fantastic, creative night shots. All in all, we're looking at around 40 minutes of portrait time.

Remember, these times are just a guide. Your wedding is uniquely yours, and we're here to capture its essence, ensuring your day looks picture-perfect and feels effortlessly joyful and genuine.

SINIELINES

SAMPLE PHOTOGRAPHY TIMELINE

This timeline is crafted for a magical day, capturing every moment beautifully. Remember, while this is a guide, we're all about flexibility and capturing those spontaneous, perfect moments as they happen!

Sample Photography Timeline

(Based on a 4:30 pm ceremony start time, perfect for an August wedding in London with a 10-hour photography package.)

- Photographer arrives. Capturing the getting-ready moments the dress, shoes, and all those unique details.
- 14:00 Bride's hair and makeup session.
- 15:00 The bride steps into her dress.
- 15:30 It's time for some stunning Bride portraits.
- 16:00 Departure for the ceremony.
- Ceremony Coverage begins. The magic and emotions of saying "I do."
- Family formal portraits. (We recommend keeping these brief so you're kept from your guests for a short time. You can take more at the reception if you'd like.)
- Cocktail hour kicks off. Mingle, relax, and enjoy we've covered the candid shots!
- The bride and groom join the cocktail hour when ready. Meanwhile, I capture the reception setup and also the guests getting seated for dinner.
- **18:45 The grand entrance.** Your moment to shine as you enter the reception.
- **19:00 Dinner is served.** (The photographer takes a break and eats we need our energy to capture your best moments!)
- 19:30 Sunset portraits with the couple
- **20:00 Speeches.** Capturing every laugh, tear, and cheer.
- 20:30 It's a quick escape for some creative nighttime portraits.
- 21:00 Cake cutting. The sweetest moments were captured.
- 21:30 First dances. Your dance floor debut as a married couple.
- The party begins. Dance, laugh, and celebrate we'll catch every moment!
- 23:00 Photographer finishes.
 - Bride & Groom Official Exit. The final, memorable shot of the night.

(If the bridal parties are nearby, I can cover both; otherwise, we'll need time to capture these moments as well.)

(The timing depends on the sunset; we aim for about an hour before. We'll adjust accordingly if winter or the sun sets early.)

(If the night extends beyond this, additional time may be needed for fireworks or a grand exit.)



The preparation phase of a wedding holds its unique charm and significance, as it's when the palpable mix of anticipation and joy shines through. Yet, amidst this flurry of emotions, it's easy to overlook the inherent chaos accompanying this day's segment.

Imagine squeezing in the bridesmaids, the makeup artist, hairstylists, and photographers into a single room brimming with makeup essentials, curling irons, hairspray, duffel bags, trash bins, water bottles, snacks, and an array of outfits. This bustling space can quickly become congested and need to be more organized. Achieving those timeless and sophisticated 'getting ready' photographs hinges on having ample space and proper lighting.


That's precisely why we emphasize the importance of thoughtfully selecting your preparation area well in advance rather than making it a last-minute decision. Refrain from restricting your choices to hotel rooms; exploring residences on platforms like Airbnb can be a fantastic alternative. These spaces often provide more captivating and aesthetically pleasing backdrops, superior lighting, and ample space to move around comfortably without feeling squeezed in.

Suppose a hotel room is your setting of choice. In that case, it's wise to consider reserving an additional room or coordinating with friends to ensure one room remains a designated, clutter-free area. This means personal items should be neatly tucked away out of sight! Would you be able to get ready at your venue? Is there a separate space where items like the dress can be showcased and photographed without distracting clutter?

Lighting, too, is a critical factor. Ideally, we prefer to work in a room bathed in natural light, allowing us to turn off all artificial lights. This helps avoid the unflattering skin tones that mixed lighting (a combination of natural light, lamps, and overhead lights) can create.

Sometimes, we might introduce studio lighting for your bridal portraits and particular 'getting ready' shots. This approach is more feasible in a room that can comfortably accommodate the light stands and flashes we use, which do require a bit of extra space. Remember, we're here to assist you in orchestrating this segment of your day, so don't hesitate to reach out for guidance. We're more than happy to help!

CULTURAL WEDDINGS

We are passionate about capturing the vibrant traditions of cultural weddings, including those that feature a mix of Western ceremonies and deep-rooted cultural practices or are entirely dedicated to celebrating specific traditions. This guide offers our top four pieces of advice to ensure you experience a joyful and stress-free wedding day.

- 1.Timing considerations are essential, mainly if your wedding includes a morning ceremony. Our experience extends to the magnificent Afghan weddings, known for their elaborate celebrations, Indian weddings with multi-day festivities, and the unique customs of Jewish and Muslim weddings. It's crucial to discuss with your photographer the best times for capturing your portraits, especially if you plan to wear different outfits throughout the day.

 Organizing these details well in advance will ensure a smooth flow.
- 2. Detailed planning is vital when incorporating various cultural elements into your wedding. This includes arranging early hair and makeup sessions if your ceremony starts in the morning. Ensure your stylist is informed about the early call time, and consider the logistics for your bridal party—will they need to arrange accommodation nearby to be there on time?
- 3. Focus on the special requirements of your wedding day. Do specific moments, like family portraits after the ceremony or a change of dress between different parts of the celebration, need special attention?







Speeches: Where will your speakers stand during the toasts? Having them close to you can capture those genuine reactions and make for some unforgettable photos.









TIPS & TRICKS

You might be realising just how much careful consideration and planning go into capturing your wedding day. It's not just a big day; it's a marathon of moments filled with people wanting a piece of your time.

From my experience shooting countless weddings, I've picked up a handful of extra tips and tricks along the way. These aren't just about enhancing your photos; they're about making your day more enjoyable and memorable.



1. HIRING A WEDDING PLANNER

For weddings with over 50 guests, seriously think about bringing on board a professional planner or at least a day-of coordinator who isn't part of your guest list or circle of friends. This person will handle all the day's queries and issues, allowing you to glide through your celebration without worrying about logistical hiccups like missing place settings, the DJ's need for an extra power cord, or ensuring the white wine is chilling properly. While it might seem nice to assign these tasks to friends or guests, remember they're there to celebrate too, and might get caught up in the festivities. A dedicated professional will ensure everything goes off without a hitch, keeping your peace of mind intact.

2. OPTING FOR AN UNPLUGGED WEDDING

Think about inviting your guests to stow away their smartphones, tablets, cameras, and other gadgets during the ceremony. We've often found ourselves adjusting our photography angles to dodge a sea of electronic devices popping up in the aisle. By removing these distractions, your guests' attention remains on you, creating a more intimate and engaged ceremony atmosphere.

Dedicating time before your wedding day to write your vows is a decision you won't regret. It eliminates last-minute stress and ensures you express your feelings just the way you want, without the rush or pressure of the day weighing on you.

8. CARVE OUT TIME FOR JUST THE TWO OF YOU

Your wedding day will fly by in an instant, and it's easy to get caught up and miss moments with each other. Schedule some alone time to step away, even for a few minutes between dinner courses, to share a quiet toast or a reflective moment. These are the memories that become priceless.
